Dear Supporter,

Thank you for your continued support. It was good for myself and the Campaign team to meet so many of you at the numerous Air Shows we attended throughout the Summer.

This latest issue of our Newsletter contains an update of where the Campaign is now, what our next steps are, and an invitation for you to join us at the Battle of Britain weekend taking place at the RAF Museum at Hendon on Saturday 13th September.

The Campaign

The Campaign has been a great success. Contrary to some inaccurate media reports, we have received the enthusiastic backing of the Mayor of London, Boris Johnson, for our plans to place a statue of Sir Keith on the 4th Plinth temporarily in late October or November 2009 for six months, with a permanent statue being erected in September 2010 most probably in Waterloo Place. This would be a fitting site and appropriate time for the statue to take up a permanent position in London, as 2010 marks the 70th anniversary of the Battle of Britain.

There has been enormous support for the Campaign from the RAF, Battle of Britain veterans, members of the Park family and even the New Zealand cricket team. We have also secured the support of the leaders of all the New Zealand political parties, including the Prime Minister and Defence Minister. In the UK more than 60 MP's from all parties are backing the Campaign and we are supported by individuals such as Tony Benn, Lord Tebbit, Sir Patrick Moore, Dan Snow and Edward Fox. Thousands of members of the public and many organisations have shown their support by signing our petition.

Campaign Aims & Next Steps

Two planning applications will soon be made to Westminster City Council. We are finalising the form of the sculptures that will grace the 4th Plinth temporarily and permanently at the site in Waterloo Place. As advised by Westminster City Council's Public Art Advisory Panel, we have asked six sculptors to make maquettes (scale models) of a single design for both the temporary and permanent statue. By mid-September the final sculpture/sculptor will be chosen, and a detailed planning application will be submitted to Westminster City Council before the end of this year.

We will of course keep our supporters updated with news on both the website and with regular newsletters. We will also ask for letters of support to be sent to Westminster's Planning Committee at the appropriate time. It is important that the officers and elected councillors at Westminster City Council, who have the ultimate decision over whether our proposals proceed, are aware of the widespread and passionate support amongst members of the public for a suitable memorial to Sir Keith Park.

We thank you again for your continued support and look forward to meeting many supporters of our Campaign at RAF Hendon on Saturday 13th September.
