Dear Supporter,

The highlight in March was our superb launch in Trafalgar Square.

April has been an even more exciting time for the Campaign, with momentum building on all fronts: the Parliamentary Early Day Motion (EDM 1206) has garnered the support of over 50 MPs from all parties; the numbers who have signed our e-petition at www.sirkeithpark.com is rising every day, with over 5000 visitors to the website; new high profile supporters such as 'Lord of the Rings' director Peter Jackson, BBC military history presenter Dan Snow and Sir Stuart Rose the Chief Executive of Marks & Spencer plc, have also pledged their backing to the campaign.

We have also maintained our reputation for high profile events with an aviation theme! Not content with a Spitfire on the ground in Trafalgar Square, we flew a Battle of Britain Hurricane and Messerschmitt 109 (sadly the British weather grounded the Spitfire) to Biggin Hill Airport, the former WW2 Fighter Base, where they were greeted by veterans, including Flight Lieutenant Bob Foster who flew the same Hurricane during the Battle, under Sir Keith's command.

The practicalities are also coming along well. We unveiled the maquette – or scale model - of the statue, made by New Zealand-based sculptor Roderick Burgess, at the RAF Club in London.

Both I and the Campaign Director visited New Zealand in early May, where we were overwhelmed by the levels of support from the family, politicians, veterans and other well wishers of our campaign. Moving forward, the election of Boris Johnson as new Mayor of London on May 1 has given us a boost as he had previously pledged his support while he sought election. I intend to meet the Mayor as soon as possible to ensure that everything possible is done in order that the statue is unveiled on the Fourth Plinth as soon as is possible.

There couldn't be a more appropriate time to unveil the statue, not least because 2008 is also the 90th anniversary of the RAF. But despite all the positive signs, and all the hard work so far, we're not taking anything for granted. We won't stop until we see Sir Keith's statue on the Fourth Plinth, and we continue to need all the support we can get. Please continue to spread the word about our campaign far and wide, and if you are minded to write to the new Mayor of London, Boris Johnson MP, that can only help too!.

Campaign Update

Friday 18 April 2008

Battle of Britain veterans, Sir Keith Park's great-great niece Leigh Park, Terry Smith, serving members of the RAF and other supporters attended a lunch and unveiling ceremony at the RAF Club in Piccadilly, London, showing off the maquette — scale model — of the final statue in its full splendour. The Campaign had also used the maquette to commission computer generated images of how the statue will look when sited on the Fourth Plinth in Trafalgar Square. Tuesday 29 April 2008

On Tuesday 29th April the Campaign organised for a Spitfire and a Hurricane, which both saw action in the Battle of Britain, to make a dramatic fly-in to Biggin Hill Airport. Sadly, the British weather kept the Spitfire grounded, but a Hurricane and a Messerschmitt 109 made a spectacular fly past before landing at Biggin Hill. They were greeted on the airstrip by Battle of Britain veterans, including Flight Lieutenant Bob Foster, who flew the Hurricane during the Battle of Britain, under Park's command. New Zealand Defence Minister lends support

Following the Battle of Britain, he was responsible for the aerial defence of the island, and within a matter of weeks reversed a German onslaught which had hitherto made Malta the most bombed place on earth.
