The Campaign is maintaining a steady momentum towards our objectives: of placing a temporary statue of Sir Keith Park on the Fourth Plinth in Trafalgar Square for six months in 2009; this will be followed by a permanent installation of a memorial statue in Waterloo Place, which all being well will coincide with the commemoration of the 70th anniversary of the 'Battle of Britain' in September 2010 (both statues are subject to planning consents from Westminster City Council).



Unveiling of Final Version of the Sir Keith Park Memorial Statue

RAF Museum Event, London (Hendon)



The Campaign Team enjoyed meeting so many supporters at the RAF Museum London (Hendon), on 13th September where the Sir Keith Park Memorial Campaign held an event in conjunction with 'Kea', the New Zealand ex-pat global community organisation. The event was a resounding success and we talked with so many of you there on the day who expressed your wealth of knowledge, on the Battle of Britain, all things military and some of you from personal family experiences during the Second World War.

Those present during the speeches now know of Sir Keith's outstanding achievements at Gallipoli, the Somme and as a pilot in WW1; followed by his command of RAF 11 Group in WWII, leading to the defeat of the Luftwaffe during the 'Battle of Britain' and his accomplishments in command of the vital air defence of Malta during the 'Siege of Malta'. Wing Commander Brett Marshall, Air Advisor with the Royal New Zealand Defence Force, highlighted the achievements of Sir Keith Park and all Pilots and support crew from the Commonwealth and elsewhere who bravely gave so much during WWII.

The Campaign Team would also like to make a special thank you to Flight Lieutenant O.V.
